Background Information:

- Title I, Part A is designed to improve the overall educational program of an eligible campus and to ensure students have the opportunity to meet challenging state assessments.
- Title II, Part A is designed to improve teacher and administrator quality and retention.
- Title III, Part A is designed to provide an additional layer of academic support for English Learners to ensure that English learners (ELs) and immigrant students attain English proficiency and develop high levels of academic achievement in English.
- Title IV, Part a Student Support and Academic Enrichment is designed to provide districts support in three areas: well-rounded educational opportunities, safe and healthy students, and effective use of technology including technology infrastructure.
- Perkins V (CTE) grant funds are designed to align CTE Programs with high wage, in-demand, and high skill
 occupations in Texas and to provide funding and opportunities for students to earn industry-based certifications,
 associate and bachelor degrees.
- Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part B funds provide services, materials, and personnel for students with disabilities.

Administrative Considerations:

- The overall purpose of Title funds are to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education.
- Part B of the IDEA grant offsets part of the local costs of the K-12 educational needs of children ages 3-21 with disabilities.
- This is a public hearing and board approval will be considered in the consent agenda.
